

Oremus (A Guide to Catholic Prayer) began as a Lenten study the last week of January and will continue for 8 weeks. Studies are being held at St. Bernard on Wednesday night and Sts. Peter and Paul on Wednesday nights and Thursday mornings.

RCIA

It seems like it was just yesterday we were celebrating Christmas and now Lent is at our door step. We are getting into a very busy phase of the RCIA program that encourages our participants to mediate more deeply on why they chose to join our Catholic faith. On February 2 Leon Potts joined with other participants from Sts. Peter and Paul that are making the same journey at St. Bernard's for a retreat. This gathering gives everyone a chance to slow down and take a good look at themselves and their spiritual lives.

With the beginning of Lent begins the Scrutiny phase of the RCIA journey. During this phase Leon, along with many others from the Evansville Diocese, will be presented to Bishop Thompson at St. Benedict's Cathedral at Evansville for the Rite of Election. Bishop Thompson will welcome them and give them words of encouragement.

During Lent our parish will be offering special prayers and encouragement at three occasions; 1st, 2nd, and 3rd Sundays of Lent. We will pray that they be filled with the Holy Spirit to guide them along their journey.

On Easter Vigil, March 30, we will welcome Leon into our Catholic community. Leon will be baptized, profess his desire and belief in the teachings of the Catholic Church, be confirmed and receive his first Holy Communion.

Please pray for Leon that he will be faithful to the Church and pass his faith along to others.

Lenten Scripture Study Opportunity

As we approach the Scriptures this session of Lent, we will study the two volume work of Luke:

The <u>Gospel According to Luke</u>: Luke's Gospel tells the story of Jesus from his birth to his death and resurrection. From Luke we have received many memorable stories and prayers not found in any other gospel. Luke is a storehouse of Christian imagery.

We will also get some insight into The Acts of the Apostles which is unlike any other book of the New Testament. Moving from the ascension of Jesus to Paul's imprisonment in Rome, it tells a story no one else recounts – the birth and growth of the infant Christian church. In Acts Luke speaks of the role of the Holy Spirit in the evangelizing mission of the early church.



We will also study two of the works attributed to John (the disciple whom Jesus loved):

<u>The Gospel According to John:</u> John's Gospel is believed to have been the last of the four Gospels to be written. From the earliest days of Christianity believers have recognized the uniqueness of this Gospel. This Gospel contains some of the most memorable stories ever told about Jesus.

<u>John's three letters (Epistles)</u>: The purpose of these letters is to correct certain false impressions about Jesus that some in the community have developed. They treat of love, light, sin, and truth over and over again.

We will conclude by bringing together events from all four Gospels that relate to the death, resurrection, and ascension of Jesus.

These classes are open to everyone. You are welcome to come and ponder on how God has intervened in human history, OUR salvation history, and how lovingly Jesus revealed our Father to us.

There is no fee. All you need to bring to class is a Bible. Classes will be held in Holy Cross cafeteria on Wednesday, February 27, and on Tuesdays: March 5, 12, and 19. All classes will be 6:00-7:30pm. If interested please call Ann Friedman (753-4387) or email afriedman@insightbb.com.

SMG Youth: Faith and Action

Last newsletter I wrote a little about what the Year of Faith means for our youth ministry. It's pretty simple: we want to increase the faith of our youth. Since then, I've realized, it's not just the youth's faith God's trying to grow here....it's ours. It's mine. I'm not going to delve too deep on that thought, but I think the point is: before we can help increase the faith of the youth, our faith, my faith, has to be strong — or at least active. Or else, it's just the blind leading the blind, so to speak. Just some food for thought.



We're going through some changes in St. Maria Goretti Youth Ministry, especially in the High School area of ministry. We've not been as successful as we'd like this year in certain areas. It's hard to know how to connect to the high school youth, to get them interested and engaged in youth ministry. For example, our After School Hangout has not been very successful this year. So we tried to revamp the program by including peer tutoring into the hangout. On a positive note, we have a little momentum going here. But we're just not sure if this will pick-up or be a lasting program.

This may seem like bad news, and in a sense it is. But we're working on it. "Faith is the assurance of things hoped for and the evidence of things not seen." (Hebrews II:I) We believe God wants to use this ministry to do good things. So our faith needs to be in the Lord, and not in a program. It seems God shines through the most when times get tough and OUR wills are broken down. Sometimes, we just need to get out of the way. So that's what we're trying to do.

We've started a Peer Leadership Team. It's a team of high school youth (9 individuals) that will be meeting once a month to discuss ideas and plan events for SMG Youth Ministry. We figure the youth can do it better than we can! And what better way to increase faith, than to put it in action! We are very hopeful that giving the youth the opportunity to use their gifts and talents for the Lord will be a key element to a blessed ministry that helps to transform lives. Please pray for our Peer Leaders! They are: from Holy Cross: Kate Bittner & Nick Sellers, from St. Bernard: Emily Rodgers & Caleb Ziliak, from St. James: Kalissa Bittner, Abe Kiesel, & Leah Raider, and from Sts. Peter & Paul: Drew Happe & Jordyn Milheiser.

Beginning on February 10, we are kick starting our Bible Study/Discussion meetings for high school youth. What better way to fan the flame of faith than learning God's Word! St. Paul told the Romans, "faith comes from what is heard, and what is heard comes through the word of Christ." We'll be using the T3 Timeline series from Ascension Press as a guide. As it says on the website, this series helps "the Bible come alive for Catholic teens by unpacking God's Word in a way they can relate to. T3 teaches teens the Bible by showing them the 'big picture' of salvation history... teens begin to wrap their minds and hearts around the Scriptures. They come to see the Bible as a relevant part of their lives." And not only will they find food for the soul, they'll also be served Sandy's Pizza!! We'll meet in the Youth Room at Sts Peter & Paul from 6:00 – 7:30 pm every 2nd and 4th Sunday evening of the month (from Feb. thru May).

Please join us in praying that our efforts are guided by the Holy Spirit and watch the bulletin for an update. And as always, if you would like to be a part of any youth programs/events I would be very happy to chat and work with you!

Lastly, SMG Youth Ministry would like to thank Judy Glaser for once again being head chef for baking kuchens for our fundraiser. And thank you all very much who supported our youth in going on the Pilgrimage for Life by buying kuchens. You helped us raise \$2,200! Wow!!!


